

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Baseco Compound, Tondo, Manila City

as of 21 May 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 19 May 2022 at around 7:43 PM, a fire incident transpired in Baseco Compound, Tondo, Manila City. The incident was declared fire out on 20 May 2022 at 12:04 AM.

- ₱210.82 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD-FO NCR warehouses.
