

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Social Disorganization in Don Carlos, Bukidnon as of 28 May 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On May 13, 2022 at around 5 AM, a shooting incident occurred in Don Carlos, Bukidnon between a group of unidentified armed men and Indigenous People (IP) claimants who are residents of the disputed area. Gunshots were exchanged resulting to five fatal casualties and one person from the IP group injured.

A total of **37 families** or **185 persons** are affected in **Don Carlos, Bukidnon** (see Table 1).

There are **37 families** or **185 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Barangay Evacuation Center** in **Don Carlos, Bukidnon** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 73,236 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 68,607 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 4,629 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Response Center (VDRC), Cebu City.
