

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Social Disorganization in Don Carlos, Bukidnon

as of 16 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 May 2022 at around 5 AM, a shooting incident occurred in Don Carlos, Bukidnon between a group of unidentified armed men and Indigenous People (IP) claimants who are residents of the disputed area. Exchanged gunshots resulted to five (5) fatalities and caused injury to one (1) person from the IP group.

A total of **37 families** or **185 persons** are affected in **Don Carlos, Bukidnon** (see Table 1).
