

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flashflood Incident due to ITCZ in Davao Region as of 20 May 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 May 2022, several areas in the Davao Region experienced flooding caused by the overflowing of the Mana River in Malita, Davao Occidental due to the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Mindanao.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,954 families** or **9,692 persons** are affected in **14 Barangays** in **Region XI** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There were a total of **52 families** or **184 persons** who took temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Region XI** (see Table 2).
