

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Namal, Asipulo, Ifugao as of 02 June 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 23 May 2022, an armed conflict transpired between the 54th Infantry Battalion of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and the New People's Army (NPA) at Sitio Likew and Sition Nampaling in Namal, Asipulo, Ifugao. On 24 May 2022, during the AFPs pursuit, another encounter was reported at Sitio Timapaya and Sitio Beleg in the same barangay which eventually resulted in the evacuation of families and persons living near the affected areas.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **122 families** or **430 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Namal, Asipulo, Ifugao** (see Table 1).

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **109 families** or **391 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** (see Table 2).

A total of **₱483,445.50** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱361,276.50** was from the **DSWD**, **₱102,169.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, and **₱20,000.00** from the **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** (see Table 4).
