

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flashflood Incident in Sultan Kudarat and South Cotabato

as of 01 June 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 29 May 2022, the municipalities of Lutayan and Lambayong in Sultan Kudarat and the municipality of Tantaran in South Cotabato experienced flooding caused by the Through of Low Pressure Area (LPA) affecting the southern sections of Mindanao.
