I. Situation Overview

On 16 June 2022 at around 10:30 AM, a fire incident occurred at Brgy. Camaman-an, Cagayan de Oro City. The fire was declared out at 12NN of the same day.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 135,702 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 83,973 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 20,698 FFPs available at DSWD FO X.
- ₱191.24 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO X warehouses.
