



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flashflood Incident due to LPA embedded along ITCZ in Region XII

as of 18 July 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 July 2022, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 695 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.7°N 132.1°E). It is embedded along Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting the southern section of Mindanao bringing cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms that may cause possible flashfloods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in SOCCSKSARGEN caused by LPA / ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **295 families** or **1,475 persons** are affected in **seven (7) barangays** in **Region XII** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱334.04 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO XII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 133,688 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 81,959 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 40,932 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
- ₱190.72 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XII warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

17 July 2022	 DSWD FO XII provided 160 family food packs, 80 family kits, 80 sleeping kits, 15 modular tents, 51 plastic mats and 51 pieces of malong to the affected families.





c. Other Activities

DATE	ACTIVITIES
17 July 2022	 The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tampakan served hot meals and provided 5 kilograms of rice to each affected family amounting to a total of ₱10,000.00. DSWD-FO XII prepositioned food and non-food items to the CIU-Satellite Office in Kidapawan City for immediate relief augmentation. 194 family food packs were also checked-in at the Kidapawan City Incident Command Post which will be distributed on Friday, 22 July 2022.


