



# **DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Ivisan, Capiz**

as of 13 July 2022, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 10 July 2022 at 4 PM, several barangays in Ivisan, Capiz experienced flooding due to heavy rains caused by the prevailing weather conditions affecting the country.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **500 families** or **1,513 persons** are affected in **six (6) barangays** in **Ivisan**, **Capiz** (see Table 1).

- 30,084 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.





# b. Food and Non-food Items (FNFIs)

DATE	ACTIVITIES
12 July 2022	DSWD FO VI in coordination with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) of LGU Ivisan, Capiz and with the assistance of the Municipal Action Team (MAT), distributed 500 FFPs, 50 hygiene kits, a set of sleeping kit, and family kit to the affected families and individuals.
11 July 2022	LGU Ivisan, Capiz provided rice and hot meals to the affected and displaced families in the affected barangays.
