I. Situation Overview

On 21 July 2022 at around 5PM, a flooding incident occurred due to localized thunderstorms in six barangays in the Municipality of Sto. Tomas, Davao Del Norte

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

There are 1,371 families or 4,470 persons affected in six (6) barangays in Sto. Tomas, Davao Del Norte (see Table 1).

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 167,713 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 90,064 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 25,920 FFPs available at DSWD FO XI.
- ₱179.85 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XI warehouses.
