



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Tabuk City, Kalinga

as of 19 July 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 July 2022, the province of Kalinga experienced partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers and thunderstorms that will bring possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains caused by the Southwest Monsoon/Localized thunderstorms that resulted to a flooding incident in Tabuk City.

The Kalinga Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) Quick Response Team (QRT) and the Regional QRT are monitoring the incident and on standby alert status. DSWD FO CAR provided technical assistance to PSWDO on DROMIC Reporting.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO CAR for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
