On 18 July 2022 at around 6:00 PM, a tornado incident associated with heavy rains transpired in Brgy. Ayugon, San Narciso, Quezon causing damaged houses in the area.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱334.04 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO CALABARZON.

2. Positioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 141,096 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 89,367 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 13,465 FFPs available at DSWD FO CALABARZON.
- ₱213.19 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO CALABARZON warehouses.

20 July 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Assistant Regional Director for Operations called an emergency meeting with the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) and Crisis Intervention Section (CIS) to immediately assess the situation and identify the necessary intervention. • Members of the Quezon Provincial Quick Response Team were mobilized and conducted Rapid Assessment and information gathering in the affected area. • DSWD FO CALABARZON Emergency Operations Center (EOC) coordinated with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) on the status of the assistance provided by the LGU and the Provincial Government of Quezon. • DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the Department of Human Settlement and Urban Development (DSHUD) for the possible provision of Emergency Shelter Assistance (ESA) to the affected families. • DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the Quezon Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) and requested to mobilize their Psychosocial Support and Processing (PSP) Team for the provision of Psychosocial First Aid (PFA) to the affected families. • Members of the Regional QRT were advised to be ready for possible deployment in the affected area for provision of Family Food Packs to the affected families. • DSWD FO CALABARZON EOC remains on alert status to continuously monitor updates on the response interventions for the affected families.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO CALABARZON for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
