



# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Cagayan de Oro, Misamis Oriental

as of 22 July 2022, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 31 May 2022 at around 6 AM, a fire incident occurred at Sitio San Isidro Labrador, Brgy. Lapasan that also affected a portion of the adjacent Sitio St. John, Brgy. Pundot in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental.

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of 252 families or 971 persons sought temporary shelter in two (2) evacuation centers in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental (see Table 2).
