

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flashflood Incident due to LPA embedded along ITCZ in Region XII

as of 19 July 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 July 2022, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 695 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.7°N 132.1°E). It is embedded along Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting the southern section of Mindanao bringing cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms that may cause possible flashfloods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in SOCCSKSARGEN caused by LPA / ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **27,205 families** or **136,025 persons** are affected in **43 barangays** in **Region XII** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

c. Other Activities

19 July 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Pikit served hot meals and provided 5 kilos of rice to 3,000 IDPs as well as 2,732 drinking waters and 2,505 meters of trapal.
17 July 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tampakan served hot meals and provided 5 kilograms of rice to each affected family amounting to a total of ₱10,000.00. DSWD-FO XII prepositioned food and non-food items to the CIU-Satellite Office in Kidapawan City for immediate relief augmentation. 194 family food packs were also checked-in at the Kidapawan City Incident Command Post which will be distributed on Friday, 22 July 2022.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO XII for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
