

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental

as of 21 July 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 18 July 2022 at around 9:00 PM, a flooding incident occurred in three (3) barangays in Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental caused by moderate and occasional heavy rains due to Southwest Monsoon.

A total of **2,726 families** or **13,630 persons** are affected in **three (3) barangays** in **Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **91 families** or **455 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Himamaylan City, Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).
