

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Lambunao, Iloilo

as of 21 July 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 July 2022 at 4 PM, several barangays in Lambunao, Iloilo experienced flooding due to scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the prevailing Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **64 families** or **339 persons** are affected in **11 barangays** in **Lambunao, Iloilo** (see Table 1).
