

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flashflood Incident in Zamboanga del Sur as of 08 July 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 05 July 2022, two (2) municipalities in Zamboanga del Sur experienced flashfloods brought by cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by the Low-Pressure Area (LPA) which is embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ).

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **6,163 families** or **30,813 persons** are affected in **21 barangays** in **Zamboanga del Sur** (see Table 1).
