

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Flashflood Incident due to LPA embedded along ITCZ in Region XII

as of 5 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 July 2022, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 695 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.7°N 132.1°E). It is embedded along Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting the southern section of Mindanao bringing cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms that may cause possible flashfloods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in SOCCSKSARGEN caused by LPA / ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **27,366 families** or **136,545 persons** are affected in **47 barangays** in **Region XII** (see Table 1).

4 August 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DSWD FO XII provided 192 Family Food Packs; 96 Sleeping Kits; 96 Family Kits; and 22 Modular Tents to families staying at evacuation centers in Tampakan, South Cotabato amounting to ₱538,827.92. • The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tampakan provided 5ks of rice per family, and served Hot Meals to the displaced families amounting to 10,000.00. • DSWD Field Office XII through DRMD distributed 178 family food packs to affected families in Kidapawan City amounting to ₱97,900.00. • The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Pikit served hot meals to 3,000 IDPs; provided 5kg of rice to 3,000 IDPs; 2,732 drinking waters; and 2,505 meters of "Trapal". DSWD FO XII through DRMD distributed 4,067 family food packs to affected families in Pikit, North Cotabato amounting to ₱2,236,850.00
17 July 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DSWD FO XII provided 160 family food packs, 80 family kits, 80 sleeping kits, 15 modular tents, 51 plastic mats and 51 pieces of malong to the affected families.

c. Other Activities

17 July 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tampakan served hot meals and provided 5 kilograms of rice to each affected family amounting to a total of ₱10,000.00. • DSWD-FO XII prepositioned food and non-food items to the CIU-Satellite Office in Kidapawan City for immediate relief augmentation. 194 family food packs were also checked-in at the Kidapawan City Incident Command Post which will be distributed on Friday, 22 July 2022.
