I. Situation Overview

On 10 August 2022, an armed conflict transpired between two (2) alleged rebel groups at Sitio Galigayan, Brgy. Macabual, Pikit, North Cotabato.

A total of 1,057 families or 4,343 persons are affected in one (1) barangay in Pikit, North Cotabato (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 662 families or 3,036 persons currently taking temporary shelter in six (6) evacuation centers in Pikit, North Cotabato. (see Table 2).
