



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STS Florita

as of 25 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 24 August 2022 at 4:00 PM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STS Florita brought moderate to at times heavy rains over Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

Issued on 25 August 2022 at 4:00 PM, the Southwest Monsoon continuously affect the western section of Northern Luzon while Metro Manila and the rest of the country may experience possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms caused by localized thunderstorms.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱760.48 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱78.41 million in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 56,008 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 11,279 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 44,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 23,452 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- 383,426 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱624.97 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO warehouses.
