

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Poblacion, Buenavista, Quezon

as of 18 August 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 15 August 2022 at around 4 AM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Poblacion, Buenavista, Quezon. The fire broke out at the Public Market of Buenavista which eventually spread to nearby houses.

A total of **46 families** or **178 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Poblacion, Buenavista, Quezon** (see Table 1).

### III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,348,612.64** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱150,742.00** from the **DSWD**, **₱1,162,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, and **₱35,870.64** from **Other Partners** (see Table 2).

- ₱164.83 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO CALABARZON warehouses.

17 August 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) of DSWD FO CALABARZON remains on alert status to monitor updates relative to the fire incident.</li> <li>• The Regional Quick Response Team (QRT) and Municipal Action Team (MAT) in Buenavista, Quezon were deployed to the affected area to assess the impact of the incident.</li> <li>• DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) IV-A, Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO), Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) of Quezon, and the LGU of Buenavista, Quezon for updates on the affected families.</li> <li>• DSWD FO CALABARZON requested data from the National Housing Authority (NHA) on the result of the damage assessment they have conducted.</li> <li>• DSWD FO CALABARZON through the Sustainable Livelihood Program (SLP) conducted assessment on the needs of the affected families since most are stall owners and tenants.</li> </ul>

15 August 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DSWD FO CALABARZON closely coordinated with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (DRRMO) for complementation of response efforts per instruction of Regional Director Marcelo Nicomedes J. Castillo.</li> <li>The EOC of DSWD FO CALABARZON together with the Regional QRT were placed on alert status and advised to be on standby for possible deployment, conduct of rapid assessment, and provision of relief intervention including psychosocial processing to affected families and individuals.</li> </ul>
