I. Situation Overview

On 12 August 2022 at around 9:19 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Punta Taytay, Bacolod City, Negros Occidental. The fire was declared out at 9:45 PM.

- 98,160 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 46,431 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 22,235 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱161.01 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
