- 97,778 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 46,049 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 14,360 FFPs available at DSWD FO CALABARZON.
- ₱177.98 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO CALABARZON warehouses.
