I. Situation Overview

1. Standby Funds

- ₱247.53 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 93,786 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 42,057 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 31,035 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱169.52 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO VI warehouses.

29 July 2022	 DSWD FO VI provided augmentation on the provision of family food packs and hygiene kits amounting to Php6,776.00 and P20,629.00, respectively.
04 July 2022	The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) Social Worker and trained Day Care Worker of Mawab, Davao de Oro administered psychosocial intervention to all affected families.

c. Other Activities

DATE	ACTIVITIES
29 July 2022	DSWD FO VI through AICS provided P10,000.00 cash assistance to the affected families.
22 June 2022	The displaced families were provided logistical support by the local government in coordination with the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council and volunteers upon onset of evacuation, and provided necessary intervention while staying inside temporary shelters.
