

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flashflood Incident in Malungon, Sarangani Province

as of 13 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 August 2022, a flashflood incident occurred in Malungon, Sarangani Province due to heavy rains caused by the Southwest Monsoon or localized thunderstorms.

A total of **40 families** or **205 persons** are affected in **one (1) barangay** in **Malungon, Sarangani Province** (see Table 1).

	of hygiene kits, medicines, vitamins, and 50 bottles of mineral water (6 liters per bottle) to the affected families. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The BLGU of Tamban provided one (1) and half sack of rice, seven (7) sacks of assorted clothes, and 20 pieces of slippers to the affected families.
