I. Situation Overview

On 28 August 2022 at around 9:00 AM, a social disorganization incident transpired in Brgy. Dunggoan, M'lang North Cotabato due to sightings of lawless elements.

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 125 families or 500 persons currently taking temporary shelter in the designated evacuation center of the affected barangay (see Table 2).

29 August 2022	The MSWDO of M'lang conducted assessment and profiling of the displaced families for identification of possible interventions.
28 August 2022	The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO) and Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) of M'lang, North Cotabato together with staff from BLGU Dunggoan conducted validation of the reported incident.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO XII for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
