

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Strong Wind Incident in Tantaran, South Cotabato

as of 15 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 August 2022, a heavy rainfall associated with strong wind due to localized thunderstorms hit the Municipality of Tantaran, South Cotabato causing damages to houses.

A total of **65 families** or **325 persons** are affected in **one (1) barangay** in **Tantaran, South Cotabato** (see Table 1).
