



DSWD DROMIC Report #16 on the Mw 7.0 Earthquake Incident in Tayum, Abra

as of 03 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 July 2022 at 8:43 AM, a 7.0-magnitude earthquake jolted the Municipality of Tayum, Abra (17.64°N, 120.63°E - 003 km N 45°W) with a tectonic origin and a depth of focus of 017 km. The earthquake was also felt in the neighboring municipalities.



٧. **Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided**

A total of \$\mathbb{P}82,138,118.45\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱66,372,212.95 from the DSWD, ₱5,919,579.50 was provided by the Local Government Units (LGUs), ₱9,327,876.00 from Non-Government Organizations ₱518,450.00 from other Partners (see Table 6).

VI. Response Actions and Interventions

The DSWD Central Office (CO), FOs, National Resource Operations Center (NROC), and Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to \$\mathbb{P}1,260,872,106.22\$ with breakdown as follows:

a. Standby Funds

A total of ₱321,813,298.70 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, ₱247,530,257.39 is the available Quick Response Fund (QRF) in the CO.

b. Stockpiles

A total of 442,161 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to \$\frac{2}{2}68,924,099.82\$, other food items amounting to \$\frac{2}{2}10,256,873.21\$, and non-food items (FNIs) amounting to \$\frac{2}{2}459,877,834.49\$ are available.


