



# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Depression (TD) "Ester"

as of 2 August 2022, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

Issued on 29 July 2021 at 11 PM: In the next 24 hours, the Southwest Monsoon will bring scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rainshowers and thunderstorms over Metro Manila, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, Romblon, Palawan, Antique, and Aklan. Under these conditions, scattered flooding and rain-induced landslides are likely, especially in the areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in the hazards maps and in areas with significant antecedent rainfall.

A total of ₱983,016.50 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱953,016.50 from the DSWD and ₱30,000.00 was provided by the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Table 6).

### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱247.53 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱2.12 million at DSWD FO MIMAROPA and ₱5 million at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱67.16 million in other DSWD-FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Depression Ester through inter-FO augmentation.

## 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 93,786 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 42,057 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 41,866 FFPs at DSWD FO MIMAROPA and 31,035 FFPs at DSWD FO VI.
- 291,990 FFPs in other DSWD-FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Depression Ester through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱672.73 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses countrywide.
