



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Maliksi II, Bacoor City, Cavite

as of 16 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 12 August 2022 at around 3:40 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Maliksi II, Bacoor City, Cavite. The fire was put under control at around 6 PM. The cause of fire is due to an electrical short circuit.

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}38,363.63\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}438,620.55\$ from DSWD, \$\mathbb{P}144,900.00\$ from Local Government Unit (LGU), and \$\mathbb{P}354,843.08\$ from other Partners (see Table 6).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱765.5 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO CALABARZON.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 98,160 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 46,431 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 13,920 FFPs available at DSWD FO CALABARZON.
- ₱165.65 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO CALABARZON warehouses.

15 August 2022	Senator Bong Revilla, Rep. Lanie Mercado, Mayor Strike Revilla, and other members of the Sangguniang Bayan of Bacoor City distributed relief packages and mineral water to the affected families.

c. Other Activities

15 August 2022	 DSWD FO CALABARZON OIC-Regional Director Mylah S. Gatchalian spearheaded the distribution of FFPs and financial assistance to 134 affected families. Each family received ₱10,000.00 financial assistance. DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the LGU of Bacoor City relative to the assistance (e.g., FNIs, gadgets, hygiene kits, and sports materials) provided by the private sectors, donors, and other stakeholders.
12 August 2022	 DSWD FO CALABARZON coordinated with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) CALABARZON regarding the distribution of 141 boxes of hygiene kits to the affected families.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO CALABARZON for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
