

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Maliksi II, Bacoor City, Cavite

as of 18 August 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 12 August 2022 at around 3:40 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Maliksi II, Bacoor City, Cavite. The fire was put under control at around 6 PM. The cause of fire is due to an electrical short circuit.

A total of **138 families** or **530 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Maliksi II, Bacoor City, Cavite** (see Table 1).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **96 families** or **368 persons** who took temporary shelter at **Maliksi Elementary School** (see Table 2).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,000,613.63** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱438,620.55** from **DSWD**, **₱207,150.00** from **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, and **₱354,843.08** from **other Partners** (see Table 6).
