



DSWD DROMIC Report #33 on the Mw 7.0 Earthquake Incident in Tayum, Abra

as of 21 August 2022, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 July 2022 at 8:43 AM, a 7.0-magnitude earthquake jolted the Municipality of Tayum, Abra (17.64°N, 120.63°E - 003 km N 45°W) with a tectonic origin and a depth of focus of 017 km. The earthquake was also felt in the neighboring municipalities.

A total of **36,278 houses** were damaged; of which, **919** are **totally damaged** and **35,359** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I**, **II**, and **CAR** (see Table 5).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱158,942,638.76 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱105,669,929.86 from DSWD, ₱27,059,738.17 from Local Government Units (LGUs), ₱17,133,213.84 from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and ₱9,079,756.89 from other Partners (see Table 6).
