

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Depression (TD) “Ester”

as of 5 August 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 29 July 2021 at 11 PM: In the next 24 hours, the Southwest Monsoon will bring scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rainshowers and thunderstorms over Metro Manila, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, Romblon, Palawan, Antique, and Aklan. Under these conditions, scattered flooding and rain-induced landslides are likely, especially in the areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in the hazards map and in areas with significant antecedent rainfall.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **3,894 families** or **16,645 persons** are affected in **48 barangays** in Regions MIMAROPA, V and VI (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **130 families** or **434 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Region VI** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱214.38 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱2.12 million at DSWD FO MIMAROPA, ₱5 million at DSWD FO V, and ₱5 million at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱668.16 million in other DSWD-FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Depression Ester through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 97,778 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 46,049 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 51,729 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 41,866 FFPs at DSWD FO MIMAROPA, 32,488 FFPs at DSWD FO V, and 27,251 FFPs at DSWD FO VI.
- 252,303 FFPs in other DSWD-FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Depression Ester through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱668.16 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses countrywide.

DSWD FO VI through the Quick Response Team (QRT) of Antique distributed an initial 50 FFPs amounting to P24,500.00 to the affected families and individuals in San Jose de Buenavista, Antique. 150 hygiene kits are in transit from Regional Warehouse to San Jose de Buenavista, Antique.
