

# DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Effects of SWM and LPA

26 January 2023, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 03 August 2022 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 320 km West of Dagupan City, Pangasinan (16.5°N, 117.4°E). The Southwest Monsoon affected the western sections of Central and Southern Luzon, and of Visayas. Cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms caused by the LPA and Southwest Monsoon (SWM) may have brought possible flashfloods or landslides due to at times heavy rains to Metro Manila, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and Visayas. The rest of the country may have experienced partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms brought by SWM or localized thunderstorms, which may have resulted to possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms.

Issued on 18 August 2022 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 310 km West of Laoag, Ilocos Norte (17.9°N, 117.6°E). The Southwest Monsoon affected the western sections of Northern and Central Luzon. Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains brought by LPA or Southwest Monsoon to the Ilocos Region, Abra, Mt. Province, Benguet, Zambales and Bataan. Metro Manila and the rest of the country may have also experienced possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms due to Southwest Monsoon or localized thunderstorms.

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **740 families** or **3,032 persons** sought temporary shelter in **26 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI, VII, and CALABARZON** (see Table 2).
