

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Cebu Province

as of 11 September 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 September 2022, heavy rains and partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms were experienced in the province of Cebu which caused flooding and landslide incidents in the affected areas.

A total of **558 families** or **2,238 persons** are affected in **10 barangays** in the **Province of Cebu** (see Table 1).

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **315 families** or **1,195 persons** are currently taking temporary shelter in **five (5) evacuation centers** in **Cebu Province** (see Table 2).

10 September 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Mandaue City government immediately attended to the needs of the affected families. 15 modular tents were set up in Casuntingan Gym. Food meals were also provided and disaster kits were distributed in the different evacuation camps. In Cebu City, displaced families inside ECs in Pit-os were also provided by the LGU with meals, bottled water and floor beds.
