

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Baesa, Quezon City

as of 6 September 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 5 September 2022 at around 9:58 AM, a fire incident occurred in Sitio Pajo, Brgy. Baesa, Quezon City. It was declared fire out at 12:43 PM. The cause of fire is under investigation.
