



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incidents in Mandaue City, Cebu

as of 15 September 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 September 2022 at around 12:17 AM, a fire incident occurred at Alinsug St., Brgy. Jagobiao, Mandaue City. Another fire incident in the same city transpired at M.L. Quezon St., Brgy. Casuntingan at around 3:07 AM. The fires were declared out at 12:58 AM and 3:38 AM, respectively.

A total of **36 families** or **132 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Mandaue City** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱517.03 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 99,808 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 57,979 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 41,829 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 30,662 FFPs available at DSWD FO VII.
- ₱199.98 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VII warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

14 September 2022	 The LGU of Mandaue City through its City Social Welfare Services (CSWS) prepared meals and distributed disaster kits to the displaced families.

c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management

DATE	ACTIVITIES
13 September 2022	 The LGU of Mandaue City set up modular tents at Cabancalan I Elementary School and deployed their mobile kitchen. Child-friendly space, couple's room, and breastfeeding room were also setup and established.

d. Other Activities

13 September 2022	 DSWD FO VII through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) and the team for Assistance to individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS) visited the Cabancalan I Elementary School to monitor the status of the affected families and assess their needs for any possible relief augmentation.
