

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incidents in Mandaue City, Cebu as of 15 September 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 September 2022 at around 12:17 AM, a fire incident occurred at Alinsug St., Brgy. Jagobiao, Mandaue City. Another fire incident in the same city transpired at M.L. Quezon St., Brgy. Casuntingan at around 3:07 AM. The fires were declared out at 12:58 AM and 3:38 AM, respectively.

A total of **36 families** or **132 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Mandaue City** (see Table 1).

A total of **2 houses** were totally damaged in **Barangays Casuntingan** and **Jagobiao, Mandaue City** (see Table 5). Most of the displaced families were residents of a 22-room apartment building which was also destroyed by the fire in Brgy. Casuntingan.
