

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Negros Occidental

as of 29 September 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 25 September 2022, low lying barangays of Negros Occidental experienced flooding due to heavy rains brought by the Southwest Monsoon / Trough of STY Karding.

A total of **245 families** or **804 persons** are affected in **nine (9) barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).
