



# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Cebu Province

as of 12 September 2022, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 09 September 2022, heavy rains and partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms were experienced in the province of Cebu which caused flooding and landslide incidents in the affected areas.

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **73 families** or **301 persons** are currently taking temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Cebu Province** (see Table 2).
