

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STY Henry as of 05 September 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 04 September 2022 at 5AM, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon Henry brought monsoon rains over the northern and western section of Northern Luzon and Western section of Northern and Central Luzon.

Issued on 06 September 2022 at 4PM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon/Localized Thunderstorms may bring possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country.
