



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Apolonio Samson and Brgy. Balingasa, Quezon City

I. Situation Overview

On 08 September 2022 at around 9:58 AM, a fire incident occurred at Kaingin Rd., Brgy. Apolonio Samson and Don Manuel St., Brgy. Balingasa, Quezon City. The fire was declared under control at 1 PM.

- 18,907 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱109.2 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
