

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire incident in Brgy. Obrero, Quezon City

as of 09 September 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 07 September 2022 at around 11:57 PM, a fire incident occurred at Sct. Santiago St., Brgy. Obrero, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at 3:12 AM on 08 September 2022.
