I. Situation Overview

On 07 September 2022 at around 11:57 PM, a fire incident occurred at Sct. Santiago St., Brgy. Obrero, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at 3:12 AM on 08 September 2022.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱517.03 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 86,039 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 44,210 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 41,829 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 18,907 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱109.2 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

08 September 2022	 DSWD FO NCR provided 70 FFPs to the affected families. The LGU of Quezon City through its Social Services and Development Department (SSDD) continuously provides the needs of the affected families. The SSDD also provided hot meals and other basic needs of the affected families. The SSDD facilitates the distribution of various donations for the affected families.




