

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Negros Occidental

as of 10 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 25 September 2022, low-lying Barangays in Negros Occidental experienced flooding due to heavy rains brought by the Southwest Monsoon / trough of Super Typhoon Karding.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **430 families** or **1,770 persons** are affected in **nine (9) barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **140 families** or **489 persons** took temporary shelter in **six (6) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).
