

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Landslide and Flooding Incident in Brgy. Lamalahak, Lake Sebu, South Cotabato as of 01 October 2022, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 28 September 2022 at around 8 PM, a landslide followed by a flooding incident occurred at Brgy. Lamalahak, Lake Sebu, South Cotabato.
