I. Situation Overview

On 08 September 2022 at around 9:58 AM, a fire incident occurred at Kaingin Rd., Brgy. Apolonio Samson and Don Manuel St., Brgy. Balingasa, Quezon City. The fire was declared under control at 1 PM.

The LGU of Quezon City through the SSDD provided basic needs of the affected families such as food and shelter (i.e., evacuation centers).
