

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flashflood Incident in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental

as of 22 October 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 19 October 2022 at around 7:40 PM, a flashflood incident was experienced in several barangays in Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental.

A total of **715 families** or **2,188 persons** are affected in **four (4) barangays** in **Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental** (see Table 1).
