I. Situation Overview

On 10 October 2022, a social disorganization incident between two (2) armed groups from Barangay Dungan, Aleosan and boundary of Barangay Bagolibas, Cotabato Province.

A total of **215 families** or **1,075 persons** are affected in **Barangay Dungan, Aleosan** and boundary of **Barangay Bagolibas, Cotabato Province** (see Table 1).

- 78,662 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 48,633 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 30,029 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
