I. Situation Overview

On 04 October 2022, a social disorganization incident between two (2) armed groups from Brgy. Lomopog, Midsayap, North Cotabato and Barangay Sambulawan (BARMM) transpired in Lomopog, Midsayap, North Cotabato.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱120.39 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO XII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 76,154 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 47,325 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 28,829 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 16,960 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
- ₱208.88 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO XII warehouses.





b. Other Activities

04 October 2022	• The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) through its Emergency Response Team conducted validation and assessment of the displaced families.
05 October 2022	 The teachers of the Kapinpilan High School initiated the set-up of the community kitchen for the displaced families. DSWD FO XII continuously coordinates with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) for constant monitoring of the status of the displaced families and for possible resource augmentation.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO XII for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
